Know the Director's Rulings

You Can Avoid a Revoke

Do you realize the real consequence of a revoke? Not only do you punish your partner and yourself with a penalty, you give an undeserving good score to your opponents.

Count your cards when you take them out of the board. Count your cards again after you spread your hand. You must see all 13 cards. Watch the card played to each trick so you follow when you have a card in that suit.

IF your partner does NOT follow to the suit led, request him to look again.

Should a revoke become established, absolutely call the director for the ruling. All situations are not the same. If you can correct the revoke before you or your partner leads or plays to the next trick, the penalty is not as severe. If YOU win the trick on which you revoke, there could be a 2-trick penalty. If your PARTNER wins the trick on which you revoked, there could be a 1-trick penalty. Never let the opponents make the ruling in any situation. Just say, "Director, please."

Wednesday Jackpot Report

Dee Moses and Joan Van Geffen made an "impossible" 7 contract to win the Grand Slam Jackpot on August 24. They won \$21.50.

To win the jackpot you must: play in the Wednesday open game, pay 50 cents to be in the jackpot pool, and bid and make a grand slam. If no one wins, the jackpot money carries over to the next Wednesday.



Bridge Acronyms of the Month (Or, You Can't HUM in the ACBL)

Would you pass a hand with 16 HCP (High Card Points) instead of opening the bidding? Would you believe that there are some conventions and bidding systems that are not allowed in ACBL play, even if fully disclosed to the opponents? (The answers are, "some people do" and "it's true".)

In systems known as "forcing pass systems" a pass when one could have opened forces one's partner to bid. (Presumably, this only applies to first or second chair bids!) This type of bidding arrangement falls under the acronym HUM, or Highly Unusual Methods. Most HUM are not allowed in ACBL tournaments.

For more details, visit www.acbl.org and search on "General Convention Chart". The convention chart document there comprises four parts: the General Convention Chart lists conventions, systems, and treatments allowed (and some specifically disallowed) in most ACBL tournament events; the Mid-Chart does the same for higher-level events at NABC's; and the Superchart lists the same for the very highest competitive events at NABC's. The fourth part is a page of recommendations for conventions, etc., to be allowed in games with an upper masterpoint limit of 20.
